Session :1 Agnikarma

Talk 1 : Agnikarma – Therapeutic Potential & Its Application

Time: 9:45 am to 10:45 am.

The first talk was delivered by Dr. Uday Talhar Sir-a renowned Agnikarma specialist at Jalgoan. Sir explained the introduction and classical concepts of Agnikarma along with important key points regarding indications, precautions, procedural steps, and therapeutic effectiveness. Sir also discussed the various instruments and materials used in performing Agnikarma and elaborated on their clinical significance in different disorders. A major highlight of the session was the live demonstration of Agnikarma on a patient suffering from corn, where sir demonstrated the complete procedure and showcased its effectiveness as a minimally invasive para-surgical technique. The session provided valuable clinical insights into the therapeutic potential and modern applicability of Agnikarma in pain and lesion management. Post talk sir was felicitated by Chairperson Dr Vishnu Bawne sir, Professor, B.R Harne Ayurveda College, Thane.

Talk 2 : Viddha Agnikarma – A Novel Modified Agnikarma Therapy”

Time: 10:50 am to 11.30 am

The second talk was delivered by Dr. Uday Kulkarni Sir, HOD and Professor of Rognidan Department at Sam Global University Bhopal. Sir elaborated on the concept and therapeutic effectiveness of combining Viddha Karma with Agnikarma as an advanced para-surgical procedure. Sir explained that the combined application of Viddha and Agnikarma produces superior clinical outcomes compared to performing both procedures separately, particularly in chronic pain management. Sir discussed the thermal cauterization techniques used in Viddha Agni and also introduced a specially designed Viddhagni instrument developed by him for better procedural precision and effectiveness. A standardized SOP for Viddha Agnikarma was demonstrated systematically, highlighting important procedural steps and safety measures. The session also included live demonstrations on patients suffering from Avabahuka and calcaneal spur, showcasing the practical utility of Viddhagni in pain management alongside medications. Post talk sir was felicitated by Chairperson Dr. Sampada Sant Madam, Dean, R.A Podar Ayurved Medical College, Worli, Mumbai.

Featured Talk and Panel Discussion

Talk 3 - Conservative Management of Surgical Diseases

Time: 12:45pm 1:45pm

An engaging Featured Talk and Panel Discussion on the topic “Conservative Management of Surgical Diseases” was conducted under the moderation of Dr. Kiran Pandit Sir, Senior Ayurvedic Consultant, Director of Gurukrupa Hospital, Thane. Distinguished panelists Dr. H.B. Singh Sir, Professor, Department of Kayachikitsa, KG Mittal Ayurved College, Mumbai, Vd. Vinay Velankar Sir, Founder President Ayurveda Vyaspith, and Dr. Shyamsundar Sharma Sir, Vice President Maharashtra Ayurveda Samellan. The discussion focused on the application of Panchakarma, para-surgical procedures, medicinal management, lifestyle modifications, and individualized treatment planning in various surgical conditions. The panellists also stressed the importance of proper patient evaluation, early diagnosis, and evidence-based Ayurvedic interventions for improving patient outcomes while reducing the need for surgical procedures whenever possible. Following the panel discussion, Dr Kiran Pandit Sir felicitated the panelists, namely Dr. H.B. Singh Sir, Vd. Vinay Velankar Sir, Dr. Shyamsundar Sharma Sir. Thereafter, Dr. Amarprakash Dwivedi sir felicitated Dr. Kiran Pandit Sir in recognition of his role as moderator for the session.

Talk 4- Promotional Talk – SG Phytopharma (Academic partner)

The post-lunch session resumed with a promotional talk which was delivered by Dr. Vikram Patil Sir, Medical Advisor & Academic Partner, S G Phytopharma. The session highlighted recent clinical researches and therapeutic efficacy of formulations such as Capsule Sunarin, Vrangro Oil for wound management, and Palsineuron. Sir elaborated on the clinical trials conducted on these drugs, their research methodology, and their effectiveness in various clinical conditions. He also mentioned that the research trial of Sunarin was conducted in the Shalya OPD of D.Y. Patil School of Ayurveda, which showed tremendous results in patients suffering from haemorrhoids. Session: 2- Marma chikitsa

Talk 5: Introduction and Importance of Marma.

Time: 3pm to 3:40pm

The fifth talk was delivered by Dr. Yunus Solanki sir, Ex-Professor, Department of Shalyatantra, R.A. Podar Ayurveda College, Mumbai. Sir explained the classical concept of Marma with Ayurvedic references, emphasizing that although Marma Chikitsa is not explicitly mentioned in all texts, the significance of Marma is extensively described in Ayurvedic literature. Sir elaborated on the various methods and types of Marma stimulation practiced and advocated by different experts and traditions. He also discussed the therapeutic role of Marma stimulation in the management of various diseases. Adding a practical and traditional perspective to the session, he shared valuable insights into the renowned Kalari massage practices of Kerala and their relevance in Marma therapy. Post talk sir was felicitated by the Chairperson Dr. Shubhangi Badole ma'am, Associate Professor, Department of Shalyatantra, YMT Ayurvedic College Kharghar.

Talk 6: Scientific Validation of Marma Chikitsa

Time: 3:45 pm to 4: 45 pm

The sixth talk was conducted by Dr. Navin Joshi Sir, Master Trainer in Marma Therapy, Dehradun. Sir meticulously demonstrated all 107 Marma points on the body of a volunteer with remarkable precision and scientific clarity. He further elaborated on the therapeutic activation of Marma points and their role in alleviating conditions such as tachycardia, while also providing valuable insights into L11 reconstruction techniques. The lecture was complemented by live clinical demonstrations on patients suffering from frozen shoulder, Calcaneal Spur and lumbar spondylosis, effectively showcasing the practical applicability and therapeutic efficacy of Marma therapy in contemporary clinical practice. Post talk sir was felicitated by chairperson Dr. Sheela Kohad Ma'am, Professor and HOD, Department of Shalyatantra, Ayurveda Mahavidyalay, Sion, Mumbai.

Talk 7- Feature Talk: Emami limited

Talk 8: Marma chikitsa in management of musculoskeletal disorders.

Continuing with the Marma Chikitsa session, the final talk was delivered by Dr. Saumyaranjan Pandey Sir, expert in Marma Chikitsa. The lecture focused on the therapeutic importance of Marma points and their role in conservative management of musculoskeletal disorders. Sir practically demonstrated Marma Chikitsa techniques for conditions like knee joint pain and frozen shoulder, highlighting the specific Marma points used and the correct methods of stimulation. The session was highly interactive, informative, and provided valuable clinical insights into the application of Marma therapy in present-day practice. Post talk sir was felicitated by the Chairperson Dr. Vishwajeet Patade Sir, Trustee, Sion Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, Mumbai.

Session :1-Raktamokshan Chikitsa

Talk 1: Therapeutic validation of Raktamokshan Chikitsa

Time: 9:45 am to 10:45 am.

The first talk was conducted online by Dr. Ramdas Avhad Sir. Sir is RAV, President of Ayurveda Mahasamhela, Maharashtra and founder of Avhad's Ayurvedic Multispeciality Panchakarma Hospital, Nashik. Sir elaborated extensively on the concept and clinical applications of *Raktamokshana*, highlighting its significance in the management of various diseases through detailed discussion of successfully treated clinical cases. The session provided valuable practical insights of procedures such as *Siravedha*, including its application through the jugular vein in emergency conditions like accelerated hypertension, as well as *Jalokavacharana* in the treatment of *Netrarogas*, *Tvacha Vikaras*, and other disorders. The lecture and clinical case discussions proved to be highly informative, clinically enriching, and deeply thought-provoking for all the delegates in attendance.

Session :2- Special Session on Ayurvedic Urology

Talk 2: Clinical insights on Ayurvedic Urology

Time: 10:45 am to 11:30 am.

The second talk was conducted by the esteemed guest speaker Dr. Narayan Sahane, Medical Director at Brahma Ayurved Multispecialty Hospital and Research Centre, Nadiad, Sir presented an insightful lecture on various urological disorders and emphasized the role of Ayurvedic principles and parasurgical interventions in the management of these challenging conditions. Through a series of clinical case discussions, Sir elaborated on the Ayurvedic approach towards conditions such as lower urinary tract infections, cystitis, and urethral strictures. The session was further enriched by practical video demonstrations of bladder washing techniques using Ayurvedic herbal decoctions, the procedure of *Uttarbasti*, and urethral dilatation employed in the management of urethral strictures. Following the session, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Dyaneshwar Chauhan, Head of the Department of *Shalyatantra* at YMT Ayurvedic Medical College.

Talk 3: Leech therapy in Wound Management

Time: 11:30 am to 12:10 pm.

Continuing the *Raktamokshana Chikitsa* session, the third lecture of *Anushalya Jijnasa 2K26* was delivered by Dr. Sheetal Asutkar, Professor and Head of the Department of *Shalyatantra* at Mahatma Gandhi Ayurveda College, Hospital and Research Centre. Ma'am delivered a highly academic and clinically oriented lecture focusing on the therapeutic role of leech therapy (*Jalokavacharana*) in the management of various surgical diseases. Through detailed case presentations, Ma'am elaborated on the application of leech therapy in different types of wounds, non-healing ulcers, diabetic foot ulcers, reconstructive surgeries, and skin grafting procedures. The session also highlighted the management of anorectal disorders such as perianal hematoma and external prolapsed thrombosed haemorrhoids, following the lecture, Ma'am was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Madhuri Bhandare, Associate Professor of *Shalyatantra* at R. A. Podar Ayurvedic Medical College.

Talk 4: Cultivation and validation of leech therapy.

Time: 12:10 pm to 1:00 pm

The fourth scientific session was conducted by Dr. Rahul Baviskar, Professor and Head of the Department of *Shalyatantra* at R. A. Podar Ayurvedic Medical College. Sir delivered an exceptionally insightful lecture on the cultivation, storage, and breeding of medicinal leeches, highlighting both classical Ayurvedic concepts and their modern-day scientific applications. The session covered the life cycle of leeches, ideal environmental conditions required for their preservation, and the various types of medicinal leeches available for therapeutic use. Sir also elaborated upon the Ayurvedic perspective of leeches as described in the classical texts of *Sushruta Samhita*, including the traditional methods of storage and maintenance, while explaining how these principles can be effectively adapted in the modern era by scientifically replicating similar conditions. The lecture was further enriched through video demonstrations showcasing the reproductive cycle of leeches, including breeding processes, egg laying, and the hatching of leeches from cocoons. Following the lecture, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Dilip Wange Sir, Registrar MCIM. Professor at R.A Podar Ayurvedic College, Worli, Mumbai.

Talk 5: Raktamokshan in clinical practice.

Time: 1:00 pm to 1:45 pm

The fifth talk was delivered by Dr. Satish Bhattad, Director of Shreeji Ayurvedic Panchakarma and Homeopathy Hospital and Research Centre. Sir presented an insightful lecture on the extensive applications of leech therapy (*Jalokavacharana*) in disorders related to both *Shalyatantra* and *Shalakyatantra*. Drawing from his rich clinical experience, Sir elaborated on the therapeutic role of leech therapy in the management of various skin disorders and vascular conditions such as varicose veins, while emphasizing the importance of scientific validation and evidence-based Ayurvedic practice. Through detailed clinical discussions and practical insights, Sir highlighted the efficacy of leech therapy as a minimally invasive parasurgical procedure with wide-ranging applications in contemporary Ayurvedic healthcare. Following the lecture, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Ashwini Patil, Professor and Head of the Department of *Shalakyatantra* at D. Y. Patil School of Ayurveda.

Talk 6: Cupping Therapy-Modified bloodletting technique

Time: 1:45 pm to 2:15pm

The sixth talk of *Anushalya Jijnasa 2K26* was conducted by Dr. Mayur Pawaskar, Senior Faculty and Consultant Surgeon at Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Sion. Sir delivered a highly informative and knowledge-intensive lecture on the principles and clinical applications of cupping therapy. The session began with an overview of the historical background of cupping therapy and its references across various traditional systems of medicine, highlighting how different medical sciences have incorporated the therapy into disease management practices. Sir elaborated on the various types of cupping therapy, including classifications based on the strength of suction, and discussed the different cupping devices and machines currently available in the market. The lecture further focused on the scientific basis and mode of action of cupping therapy, wherein Sir explained the neuronal mechanisms involved along with the role of vasodilation mediated through nitric oxide (N₂O) release. Through detailed clinical explanations, Sir also discussed the wide range of diseases and conditions that can be effectively managed with cupping therapy. The session provided delegates with valuable academic and practical insights into this evolving parasurgical modality. Following the lecture, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Shubhangi Wankhedkar, Associate Professor at Shree Saptashrunji Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Nashik.

Session :3-Ksharkarma Chikitsa

Talk 7: Insights on ksharsutra preparation.

The seventh scientific session was delivered by Dr. Sharad Thube, Professor at Gune Ayurvedic College, Ahmednagar. Sir presented a highly insightful lecture on the preparation and therapeutic significance of *Kshara* and *Ksharasutra* in Ayurvedic surgical practice. The session covered the classical references of *Ksharasutra* as described in Ayurvedic literature, along with detailed explanations regarding its preparation, standardization, and physicochemical properties. Sir further elaborated on the mechanism of action of *Ksharasutra* and its clinical utility in the management of various anorectal and surgical disorders. Through his scholarly discourse and practical understanding of the subject, Sir effectively highlighted the scientific basis and enduring relevance of this unique parasurgical modality in contemporary Ayurvedic practice. Following the session, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Rajashree Kolarkar, Professor and Head of the Department of *Shalyatantra* at K. G. Mittal Ayurvedic College, Mumbai.

Talk 8: Drug of choice in management of anorectal diseases.

Time: 3:15pm to 3:45pm

The eighth scientific session was conducted by Dr. Mahendra Shinde, Senior Ayurvedic Consultant and Director of Divine Ayurveda Pharmaceuticals. Sir delivered a comprehensive and clinically oriented lecture on the pathophysiology and management of various anorectal disorders, including *Arsha*, *Parikartika*, *Bhagandara*, *Gud Bhransha*, *Gud Daha*, *Gud Paka*, and *Gud Kandū*. Sir not only elaborated upon the disease pathology and treatment modalities described in classical Ayurvedic texts but also provided practical clinical guidance for delegates regarding the management protocols to be adopted in day-to-day practice while thoroughly discussing the rationale and therapeutic action behind every step involved in the management process. Following the lecture, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Sunita Magar Maam, Professor in the Department of *Shalakyatantra* at YMT Ayurvedic Medical College, Kharghar.

Talk 9: Validation and application of kshar sutra therapy.

Sir further explained the different methods involved in the preparation of *Ksharasutra*, emphasizing the importance of standardization and procedural precision. Detailed discussions were also conducted on the SOP of Ksharsutra ligation techniques and practical applications of *Ksharasutra Therapy* in the management of diseases such as fistula-in-ano, pilonidal sinus, sentinel tags, Haemorrhoids and other diseases. Following the session, Sir was felicitated by the Chairperson, Dr. Ramesh Jadhav, Associate Professor at R. A. Podar Ayurvedic Medical College, Mumbai.

Talk 10: Role of ksharsutra in fistula in-ano.**Time: 4:15pm to 4:45pm**
